RECREATING VINTAGE QUILTS

Mention the words vintage quilts to most people and images of family heirlooms come to mind. These wonderful, timeworn beauties are treasured keepsakes carefully stored in attics, closets, drawers, or proudly displayed on beds, walls and shelves. Looking beyond the sentimental value of these quilts, we find visually striking examples of bold patterns, warm colors and wonderful workmanship. It is the sentiment and the beauty that entice even the most novice quilter today to create an heirloom quilt. And for many quilters who love these vintage quilts, they find they are worth repeating and will reproduce them in a variety of fashions in order to recapture their essence, preserving them once again for generations to come.

Recreating a vintage quilt today is easier than it was thirty years ago when America's bicentennial rekindled an interest in the art of quilting. Then, any quilter wishing to recreate the quilts of their great grandmother found that quality cotton fabrics were not readily available and color and print choices were very limited. Today, there are many lines of reproduction fabrics and patterns, along with modern tools, books, plus classes,

groups and organizations to help move the process along and quilters are taking advantage of these resources.

A special quilt exhibit, "WORTH REPEATING: RECREATING VINTAGE QUILTS", will be held October 9, 2007–February 23, 2008 at the Grout Museum of History and Science, 503 South Street, Waterloo, Iowa. The exhibit features vintage quilts next to contemporary reproductions. Visitors will also discover the process of recreating a line of fabric based on the fabrics found in vintage quilts. Quilts on display will include examples made by area, state, and national quilters who enjoy working with reproduction fabrics as well as old fabrics, quilts, blocks and tops in order to create contemporary quilts.

Please note that due to construction of the new addition of the museum, the opening and closing dates may be delayed or extended. Call before coming to check on the status of all exhibits. 319/234-6357.

WEDNESDAY, October 24

KALEIDOSCOPIC WATERCOLOR WITH OCTAGONS

In a 6 hour class, you will create both octagonal blocks and magic diamonds. Because the triangles for octagons use a relatively narrow slice of fabric, each block creates a pattern that is very different from the original fabric. When octagons are coupled with magic diamonds, they fill the entire surface with pattern and color in a way that no other process can. Less than 6 yards of fabric will provide you with all you will need to create this magical quilt.

THURSDAY, October 25

9 am to 4 pm

CUBES: HOLLOW AND OTHERWISE

It is the feeling of dimension that turns a hexagon into a cube—an illusion. We've all seen cubes, but what if they were open on one side, or all sides, or just

sliced open. What would you be looking at? What if a cube were inside a cube? How would it look? In this 6 hour class, you will learn how to open a cube in all directions and in many ways. All you need are several fat quarters each of light, medium and dark fabrics. You will complete at least 7 different forms of cubes and leave the class with a good understanding of their vivid dimensionality as well as how you might use them in your quilts.

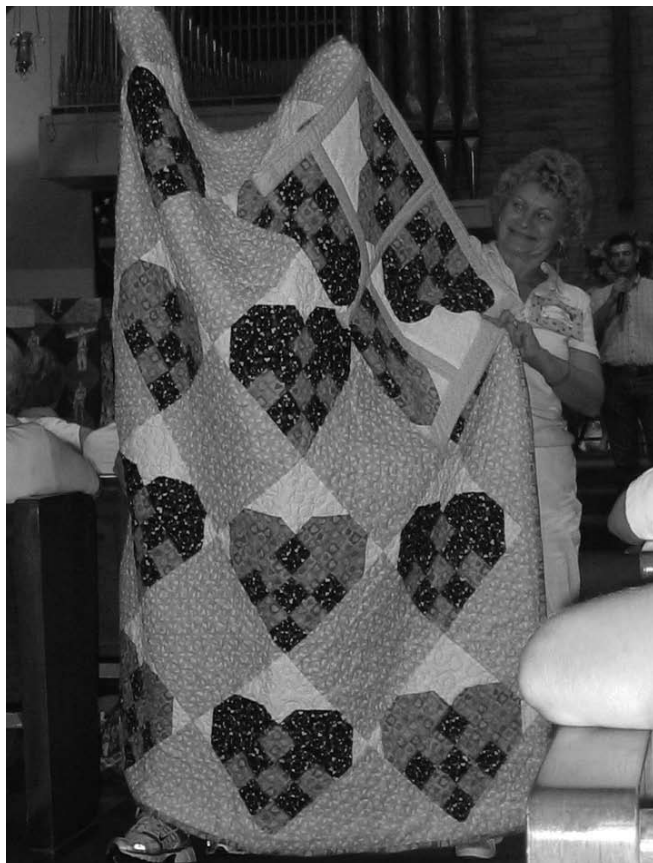

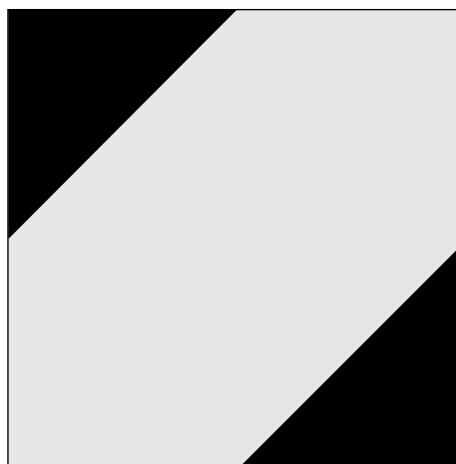
DIRECTIONS FOR 4" FINISHED HATCHET BLOCK

Cut the following for each block:

Background—one 4½" square

Accent Fabric—two 2½" squares

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each of the accent squares. Place one on a corner of the background square. Sew on the drawn line. Square up. Repeat on the opposite corner. Use a permanent marker to sign your block.



FROM THE Comments Box

We have received several comments since setting out our Comments box at the guild meetings.
Thanks so much for sharing your thoughts.

“In response to the last letter in *PieceTime* regarding the choice of speakers and their presentation, you have added at least three new members from the Fort Dodge area because of what DMAQG has to offer. Believe me, this is why we are traveling about 90 miles (one way) for these presentations. We go home very inspired and excited. Please keep up the good work!”

“Is it possible to have a form to fill out that suggests names of speakers we would like to see? It would be nice to have a variety of speakers during the year. We should avoid leaning too heavily toward one aspect of quilting (i.e. art quilts, appliqué etc). Before going to a movie, most people like to see a preview or read a critique. I wonder if the guild could give us a better preview of the upcoming speakers by possibly showing examples of the speaker through a slideshow or by displaying books and patterns? This could be done at the Christmas tea.”

“After reading the comments in the last newsletter, I wanted to point out a couple things as well as make a comment. We have a pretty diverse membership with all skill levels included. Some members work outside the home, some don't. I don't know what the age range is, but I'm sure it's fairly wide. We all have different interests whether it's hand or machine work or traditional or art quilting. I feel that our program chairs

are doing a pretty good job getting speakers that cover these differences.

Fact: YOU CAN'T PLEASE EVERYONE AT THE SAME TIME. If certain people feel that their interests or skill level is being ignored, GET INVOLVED! Either provide some suggestions for the current program chair or take on the job yourself.

Personally, I want workshops that will stretch my creativity. If I already know how to do it, why take a class?

As far as changing our meeting day, yes, Saturdays would be more convenient for me to take a workshop but I am happy with Tuesday nights and our current venue for meetings. I don't feel it's necessary to give our Board the hassle of finding a different meeting place. Why would anyone have to “sneak off on Friday on vacation”? Just take a vacation day; you're entitled to them! And why would Wednesday be less convenient than Friday? I don't get it.

I do NOT agree that we should save money by publishing the newsletter every other month. Given the timeliness of information, I don't think it would be practical. Why not just use cheaper paper? The comment printed read “Most is repeat information and we all keep the *PieceTime* to refer back to.” I don't agree—some info might be repeated, but that's OK with me. Truthfully, I have trouble finding my newsletter a week after receiving it, much less older ones to refer back to. I doubt I'm the only one. In a perfect world, we would all be super-organized but it's not a perfect world.”
