## From the President

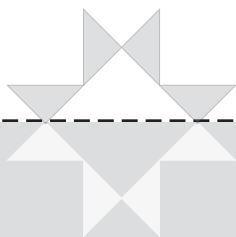
Finally, we are having some good weather to work outside. My garden, flower beds, and pots are planted.

## SHOPPING WITH TERRY

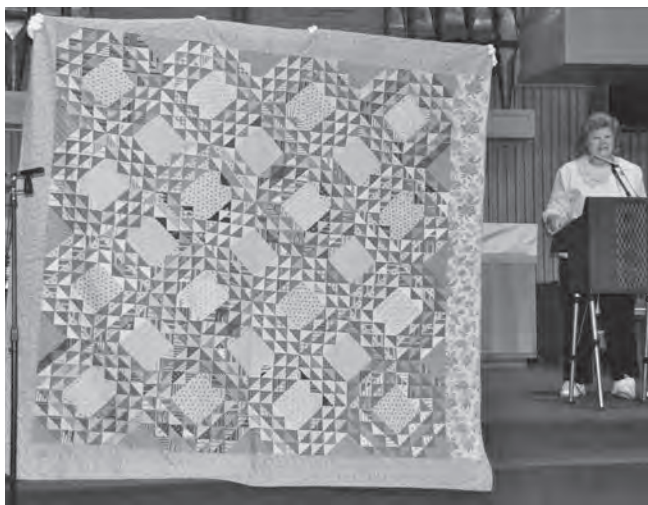

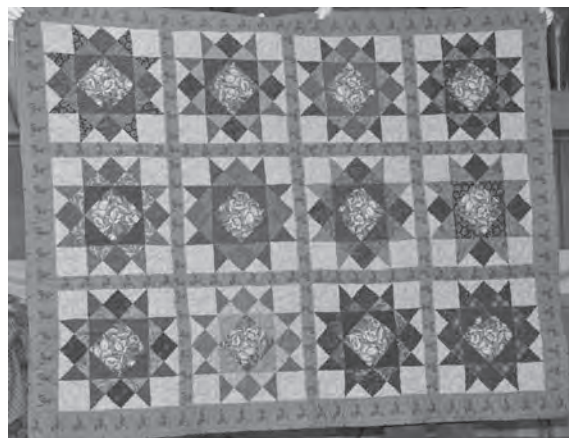

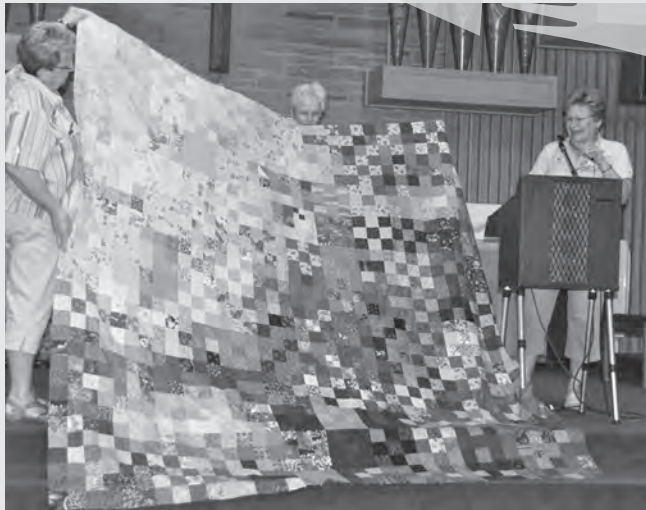


This star quilt was used in Suzanne Swenson's workshops, "Stars all Around" and "Hang 'Em Straight"

# Community Service

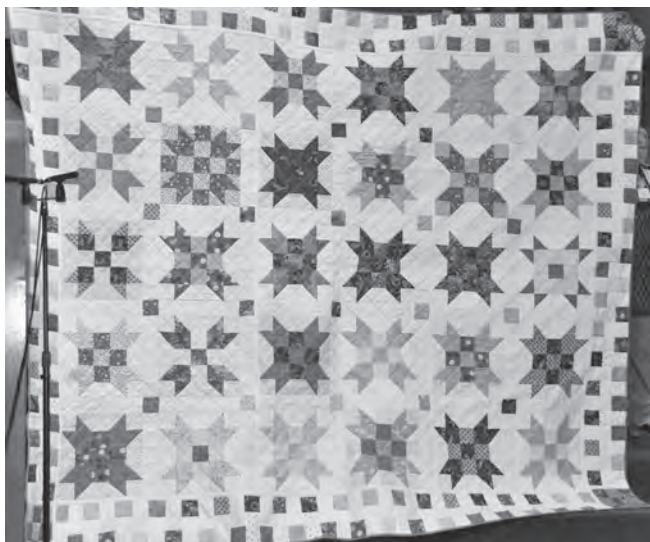

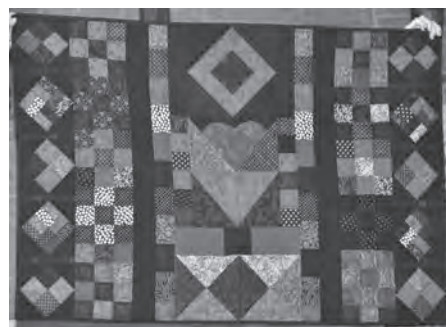
Thanks to all who participated. I am in need of volunteer quilters. HELP! Whether you are a short- or long-arm quilter, we need your help, please.

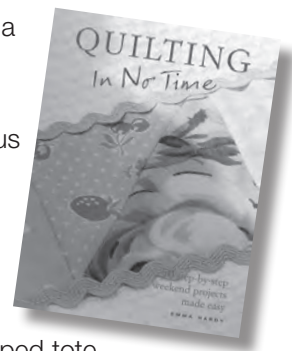

Making a cozy baby quilt, matching pillows for your sofa, or a fashionable bag doesn't have to take a lot of time—or money. Learn how to make them yourself with the help of *Quilting in No Time*. Filled with inspirational photos, the book features 50 easy and time-savvy quilted projects for the home. You'll find ideas for a variety of living spaces—kitchen and dining rooms, bedrooms, work and play areas, laundry and bathrooms, and outdoor entertaining areas. Best

yet, many of the projects require a relatively small amount of fabric, so they're a great way to use up your stash of scraps from previous projects.

Try your hand at making a pretty patchwork liner for your sewing basket, a stationery folder for your pencils and notebook, a striped tote bag, or a delightful tea cozy for your favorite teapot. Ruffled chair cushions, floral-shaped place mats, and cheerful trivets dress up the dining room. For the kids, there are fun projects such as a toy bag, a polka-dot play mat, and a baby ball. And of course, there are plenty of ideas for cozy quilts, including a colorful throw for the sofa, a vintage-style picnic blanket, and a bold-print crib quilt. Every project comes with step-by-step illustrations, plus ideas for variations to add your own signature touch to the finished product. Also included is a helpful section on useful sewing techniques with expert advice on fabric selection, finishing touches, and essential equipment.

# DMAQG QUILT ENTRY INFORMATION

It's time to enter your quilts in this year's DMAQG quilt show. You can enter online again this year - it is the preferred method of entering your quilts. You may also use the entry form in this issue and either mail it or bring it completed to the June guild meeting. The DEADLINE for DMAQG entries is July 15, 2009.

Please look over all the information in this month's newsletter about quilt entry categories and dimensions. The categories and dimensions have been changed slightly from last year. It is very important that you enter your quilts in the correct "size" category, especially if you are having the quilt judged.

We encourage you to consider your quilt for judging. We have an experienced judge for our show and believe it is an excellent learning experience to get feedback on our work. The fee of \$5 per judged quilt can be paid when you mail your entry form or you can make your payment at the June guild meeting. All payments are due by July 15, 2009.

### Other things to note about quilt entries:

- You must be a current member of DMAQG to enter quilts in the DMAQG show.
- You may not enter the same quilt in both the DMAQG show and AQS show.
- You may not enter a quilt that has hung previously in a DMAQG show.
- Your entries must be clean and free of odor and pet hair.
- Your entry must have a sleeve for hanging.

We have so many talented quilters in our guild. We are looking forward to another year of wonderful quilts entered and displayed in our show this year.

## QUILT SIZE REQUIREMENTS FOR DMAQG QUILT SHOW

Category	Minimum Dimension	Minimum Perimeter	Maximum Dimension	Maximum Perimeter
Miniature			< 20" x 20"	80"
Small			< 40" x 40"	160"
Medium	≥ 40" x 40"	160"	< 60" x 60"	240"
Large	≥ 60" x 60"	240"	< 110" x 110"	440"

**Note:** The perimeter is the sum of all sides. Quilts that are round, rectangular, oval, or other unusual shape should use a circumference or perimeter measurement and be entered in the most applicable size category.

## DMAQG QUILT-ENTRY DEFINITIONS

**All quilt entries, including clothing items, must be quilted. All entries must have three layers. Framed items may be entered in the appropriate category, but will not be judged.**

**APPLIQUÉ:** Any quilt using appliqué as the predominant construction technique. It may be hand or machine appliquéd.

**CLOTHING:** Wearable quilted items, i.e. jackets, vests, etc.

**MINIATURE:** Any quilt with a circumference of 80" or less that reflects a true proportionately-reduced scale version of a larger quilt. It may be pieced or appliquéd.

**MISCELLANEOUS:** Quilted items such as table runners, dolls, purses, tree skirts, etc.

**NONTRADITIONAL:** Any quilt that is constructed with nontraditional techniques. It may include mixed techniques as long as one of the techniques is nontraditional (fused or raw edge appliqué, painting, embellishments or other surface elements). Work may be done by hand or machine.

**PICTORIAL:** Any quilt that depicts a person, place, thing, or scene in a realistic or abstract manner. It may include piecing, any type of appliqué or embellishment, as well as any abstract quilting or techniques not included in any other category. Work may be done by hand or machine.

**TRADITIONAL:** Any quilt that is predominantly pieced and based on a traditional patterns and settings.

**ONE-PERSON QUILT:** Any quilt completely constructed by one person. All work may be done by hand or machine. Important: ALL work, including quilting, must be done by only one person.

**TWO- (OR MORE) PERSON QUILT:** Any quilt that two or more people worked on, in any way, during the construction, quilting, or finishing. This includes quilting done for hire. Work may be done by hand or machine.



## 2009 AQS QUILT EXPO – DES MOINES ENTRIES

The maker(s) of any quilt may enter their completed work in the AQS Quilt Expo by submitting an entry blank, the entry fee, and two digital images on a CD-ROM: one full view showing all four edges and one close-up. Entrants must follow all AQS rules and enter the quilt in the appropriate category.

### **CATEGORIES:**

**Bed Quilts:** Fabric quilts made for a bed, using any quilt-making technique.

**Wall Quilts:** Fabric quilts designed to hang on a wall, using any quilt-making techniques.

3. Traditional
4. Innovative

**Fabric Art:** Works of visual art utilizing fabric as the primary medium.
