Instructions for making clothing protectors

Supplies needed:

- 1 hand towel (approximately 15 in. wide)
- 2 pieces of fabric (at least 12 x 18 in.)
- 1 1 inch button or 2 large snaps

Cut $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches off one end of the towel.
Lay the cut edges of both pieces together so their right sides are on top, this will ensure the bottom finished edges of the towel will look the same. Stitch across the top to hold the two towel pieces together.

Pin the pattern to one piece of fabric that has been folded lengthwise with the wrong sides together and cut along the pattern edges. Repeat procedure with the second piece of fabric. With the wrong sides up fold and press the bottom edges of both pieces in $\frac{1}{4}$ inch. Place the two pieces right sides together and with a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance stitch together leaving the folded straight bottom edge open. Clip curved edges, turn out and press.

Insert the towel into the open bottom of the sewn fabric at least $\frac{1}{2}$ inch. Pin and stitch together. Finish off by top stitching around the entire fabric piece.

For a closure you can either make a large buttonhole and sew on a button or sew on two large snaps.
