Moonlit/Sunlit: An Introduction to Creating a Landscape Quilt

One of the things I hear quite often is “Oh, I could never make a landscape quilt. I have no idea where to start and it would be too hard”. With that in mind I decided to create a landscape quilt pattern that would not only be easy to create but would allow for a variety of personal color choices and embellishment options. What I came up with the Moonlit/Sunlit pattern. This little quilt finishes at 20 x 16 inches and can be created out of fat quarters or smaller scraps. This simple little quilt goes together in a couple of hours, and can be finished with a variety of different embellishments – paints, beads, flower buttons, etc. the possibilities are absolutely endless. Class limited to 20 students

1 Fat Quarter (18 x 22) for background sky

1 Fat Quarter (18 x 22) for large tree

9x22 strip for large body of water

8x22 strip for the foreground

4.5x22 strip for background hills

2.5x22 strip for background reflection

5x9 scrap for moon/sun reflection

7x3 scrap for island

7x7 scrap for small island trees

4x4 scrap for sun/moon

Small scrap for island tree trunks

A variety of colored scraps for leaves

2 yards Heat-n-Bond Lite

Ultra Fine point sharpie

Painters tape

Ruler, Rotary cutter, scissors, cutting mat
