

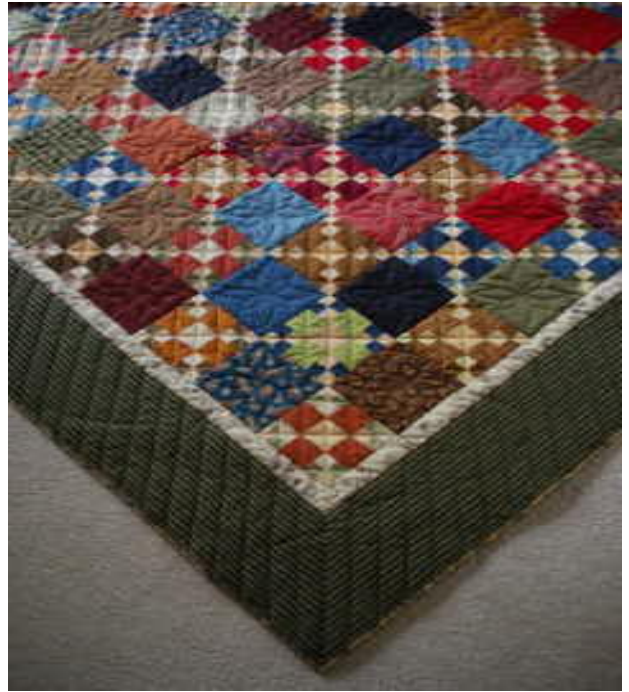

“Crossroads Scrap Quilt”

One of the things I love about doing scrap quilts is that I learn something new about fabric combinations with each quilt I do. The construction technique for this quilt contain a bit of magic! Using four patch blocks in the construction of this nine patch variation will really allow you to fine-tune your piecing and fabric selection skills. **This class is limited to 16 students.**

Proficiency: All levels

Cost: \$50



Supply List:

Large quantity of a variety of scraps: NOTE: YOU WILL BE CUTTING SOME OF YOUR FABRIC BEFORE CLASS. INSTRUCTIONS WILL BE EMAILED TO PARTICIPANTS

Pencil and paper for note-taking

Sewing machine in good working order (remember your power foot and cords)

Extension cord / multiple plug outlet strip

3-prong adapter if needed

Table light (such as an Ott light or something similar. This is optional, but past students have found they enjoy having extra light at their work station.

Sewing machine needles: size 70/10 or 75/11 for machine piecing

Thread for piecing: neutral thread to coordinate with fabric (NOT quilting thread)

Fabric scissors

Seam ripper

Rotary cutter, Mat, and Ruler (*I suggest you bring 2 rulers if you have them. They can range between 3" -6" wide, and 12" - 24" long*)

ALSO: a small ruler, such as a 5" - 7" square, that has a 45 degree angle coming from the corner

Straight pins (as fine as possible, about 1" long)

Masking tape

1 yd. white flannel (for flannel wall)
