“Hawaiian Applique”

The lacy elegance of paper snowflakes is translated into fabric in this applique technique indigenous to the Hawaiian Islands. Surround a 12” central motif with an elegant applied border. The resulting 24” piece is stunning by itself, or spectacular as the central medallion for your next quilt. Students will learn how to design a motif, apply it to the background, and applique with invisible stitchery. This is a handwork class; no sewing machine required. **This class is limited to 16 students.**

Proficiency: Hand applique at all levels

Cost: \$50

Supply List:

scissors for fabric and paper

pencil with eraser

thread to match applique fabric (NOT quilting thread)

white thread for basting

1 yd. solid fabric for background*

1 yd. colored fabric for applique*

*100% cotton, prewashed, pressed

Traditionally, solids are used, but you may use prints if desired for a totally different effect. If you are unsure, bring along solids and prints, and you may decide after seeing the samples.

thimble (opt): if you are comfortable using a thimble for hand stitching, but not required
straight pins

needles (size 9-10 quilting or applique needles recommended)

light for your work station (Ott light or something similar: we are doing hand sewing. Good light is essential. You may like additional light at your work station)

extension cord for your light: 3 prong adaptor if necessary
